At Woodrow Wilson, United Way of Salt Lake partners with Granite School District, the City of South Salt Lake, and many other partners to provide programs and resources for families. Woodrow Wilson serves over 750 students and is a Title 1 school. Nearly 90 percent of students qualify for free and/or reduced price lunch. Woodrow has a diverse population comprised of many immigrant and refugee families — over 25 languages are spoken at the school and about 60 percent of students are English Language Learners. The Community School is open from 7:30 a.m.-8 p.m., and has an after-school program (K-6th grade), and an evening program for adults.

Woodrow Wilson is committed to keeping kids on track by supporting student achievement in math, science, and reading.
